Firm marks 10 years with gifts

Good causes across the region are receiving a financial boost thanks to a fund set up by a Norfolk businessman to celebrate his firm's 10th anniversary.

Eighteen organisations from Norfolk, Suffolk and Cambridgeshire are benefiting from the fund set up by Carl Lamb, managing director of Almary Green Investments, based at the Meridian Business Park, Thorpe St Andrew.

Among those to benefit are the Whitlingham Boathouses Foundation, the Lowestoft-based Excelsior Trust and the Beccles-based Waveney Stardust project.

Mr Lamb said: "My colleagues and I at Almary Green are delighted we can celebrate our decade of success as a business by making a contribution to a community which has supported us."

Mr Lamb, who chaired the selection committee, said Almary Green had received 55 nominations for awards.

The awards were presented at a reception in the Hostry at Norwich Cathedral last week followed by another reception in Cambridge.

Whitlingham Boathouses Foundation, based near Norwich, received £2,000 towards the purchase of an adaptive scull suitable for disabled and novice rowers.

David Ashcroft, from Whitlingham Boathouses Foundation, said: "It is very exciting to be given this award and we are very grateful. It will open doors to people who couldn't otherwise take part in a sport which is so good for people of all ages, all levels of ability and disability and all backgrounds."

Excelsior Trust, which enables young people to work as part of the crew of the historic fishing vessel, has received £1,000, which will be used to purchase up-to-date navigational equipment.

The Waveney Stardust project, which enables elderly and disabled people to enjoy the Norfolk and Suffolk waterways, has been given £300, which will be put towards the finishing touches of the project's second boat.

Appeals manager Sue Hayward said: "Waveney Stardust 2 will be launched on October 30 and we are still

raising funds for the final fittings. Fundraising is particularly difficult in the present climate and it always seems hardest to get money for the last bits and pieces without which the boat couldn't be used so we are very grateful indeed for Almary Green's wonderful generosity."

Man threatened into giving away phones

Three robbers armed with knives told a man to hand over his phone as they threatened him on a Norwich street.

Police are appealing for witnesses to theft which happened on Exeter Street, off Dereham Road, at about 11.55pm on Sunday. The victim had been walking to a friend's house when he spotted a man tying his shoelaces beside a tree next to the Ferndale

Business Centre. As he approached, the man pulled out a knife. The victim suffered a cut to his hand as he tried to defend himself. Another two men, also with knives, then appeared from around a corner, and demanded his phone. The victim gave them his two phones and the three suspects ran off along Exeter Street and turned left into Orchard Street. One of the

robbers was described as white with large black bushy eyebrows, 5ft 7in to 5ft 8in tall, of slim build and aged 17 or 18. He was wearing a black coat with the hood up, a black scarf with a white pattern on it, and black trainers.
